'There are varieties of gifts, but the same spirit'- Corinthians 12, 4

The day of our Confirmation may live long in our memory, something still vivid to us, the occasion, the liturgy, the music, the family gathering, those who prepared us, however, for some this memory may have faded. In the life of the parish when we celebrate the Confirmation of others in our families, in our community, perhaps those we know, those we encourage or prepare, we have an opportunity to consider again how the living Lord Jesus has indeed touched us, come to us and how the Holy Spirit has enlivened us. From St Paul's letter, our Second Reading today, we hear something harping back to our own Confirmation. Something that will happen again in a few weeks' time in our parish. The Holy Spirit, which guides and governs the Church, will be poured out upon some of our young parishioners and there will be a variety of gifts imparted by the descent of the Holy Spirit. By this descent our young people are touched by God, He gifts again His life-giving Spirit to them, which we all need to live the Christian life. The gifts of the Holy Spirit allow us to function in the Church, the Body of Church, in our proper way, in our proper service. Think of the stewards in the Gospel at the wedding in Cana, a variety of people, like at any event, working in a variety of ways according to their talents, abilities, drive, or instruction. All the stewards are directed by our Blessed Lady to, 'do what the Lord tells them to do.' They become stewards of the Lord, they continue in their earthly, worldly work, but now listening for the Lord's voice to lead them, by this, the voice of God they are abundantly fruitful. In the sacraments we listen to the Lord leading us, we are touched to hear his leading us in the world and so we can be fruitful stewards, disciples and apostles to our neighbour, our parish, and our world.
