ADVENT: THE SEASON OF OUR LADY

Pope Saint John Paul II once said, "In this journey of expectation and hope that is Advent, the Ecclesial Community is identified more closely than ever with the Most Holy Virgin. May it be she, the Virgin of expectation, who helps us to open our hearts to the One who, by His coming among us, brings the priceless gift of peace to all humanity."

Indeed, in this week when we keep the great solemnity of the Immaculate Conception and the memorials of Our Lady's visitations at Loreto and Guadalupe, we recall this is Our Lady's season. She is the new Eve, the Mother of all the living, she is the new Ark of the Covenant containing in her the Godhead. She is the 'mould' in which our Lord is shaped, in which the whole of creation is rendered and shaped anew.

Use Advent to ponder in your heart the mysteries of God, after the pattern of Our Lady, seek the forgiveness of Christ that is so completely prepared for in her Immaculate womb. Serve others as Our Lady did in her visitation to Elizabeth. O Mary, Queen conceived without original sin, pray for us.

DIOCESE OF LANCASTER CENTENARY

Bishop Goss of Liverpool's visit to Garstang in 1858 provided an occasion for the suggestion of a new diocese. However, Bishop Goss acknowledging the expansion of the Church in those days, hoped he would never see this division of his beloved diocese himself. He remarked that he *"cherished North Lancashire as the brightest gem in his mitre."* No contemporary views from Hexham & Newcastle are known of concerning their territories in Cumberland and Westmorland!
